5. ORIENTATION & REGISTRATION OF 100L STUDENTS AND 200L DIRECT ENTRY NEW STUDENTS

New students will undergo orientation to get acquainted with the University's iconic, lush, green and fascinating environment, academic programmes, rules and regulations, faculty and staff of the various schools and departments. They will also register as students by going through a process of personal and academic information documentation. Both the orientation and registration of new students will run from November 1 through November 6, 2021.

6. RAPID ANTIGEN TESTING

We wish to reiterate that the goodness and wellbeing of our students is one of our top priorities. Mindful of the serious threat to human lives by the COVID-19 pandemic, especially with the discovery in the country of the highly transmissible Delta variant of the virus, the University is repeatedly up-scaling efforts to guarantee safety of all within the Institution's campus.

In this regard, returning students from different places and parts of the country will be required to undergo Rapid Antigen testing at a cost of N10,000 (Ten Thousand Naira only) to the student. The student will wait for about 20 minutes for the result. Positive cases for the Rapid Antigen will proceed to do the PCR test at the cost of N25,000 (Twenty-Five Thousand Naira only) also to be borne by the student. Evidence of payment for the test will be required on resumption at the University Amphitheatre, venue for the testing. If the result of the student is okay, the student proceeds straight to the hall of residence.

7. **ACCEPTABLE MODES OF PAYMENT** for the COVID-19 screening are as follow:

- 1. Bank Draft issued in favour of **Babcock University (Health Services)** to be presented on arrival.
- 2. A direct fund transfer to Babcock University (Health Services) account with: Bank: **UBA**. Account number: **1019218642**



Every student who pays by a direct transfer payment is to print out the transfer document (debit advice or pay-in-slip) and submit it to the Bursary staff on arrival. Student's full name and matric number or Application ID should be boldly written on the reverse side of the transfer document and submitted to the Bursary staff who will issue an interim manual receipt until payment is confirmed in the bank statement.

- **8. NOTE**: All **fresh** and **returning** students are required to:
 - Come with their COVID-19 safety kits on resumption.
 - Students who can afford it may come with their infrared thermometer.
 - Only students with proof of payment of school fees, or sufficient balance in their student accounts will be allowed on campus.
 - While on campus, students are required to adhere strictly to the COVID-19 protocols as approved by the Federal Ministry of Health.
