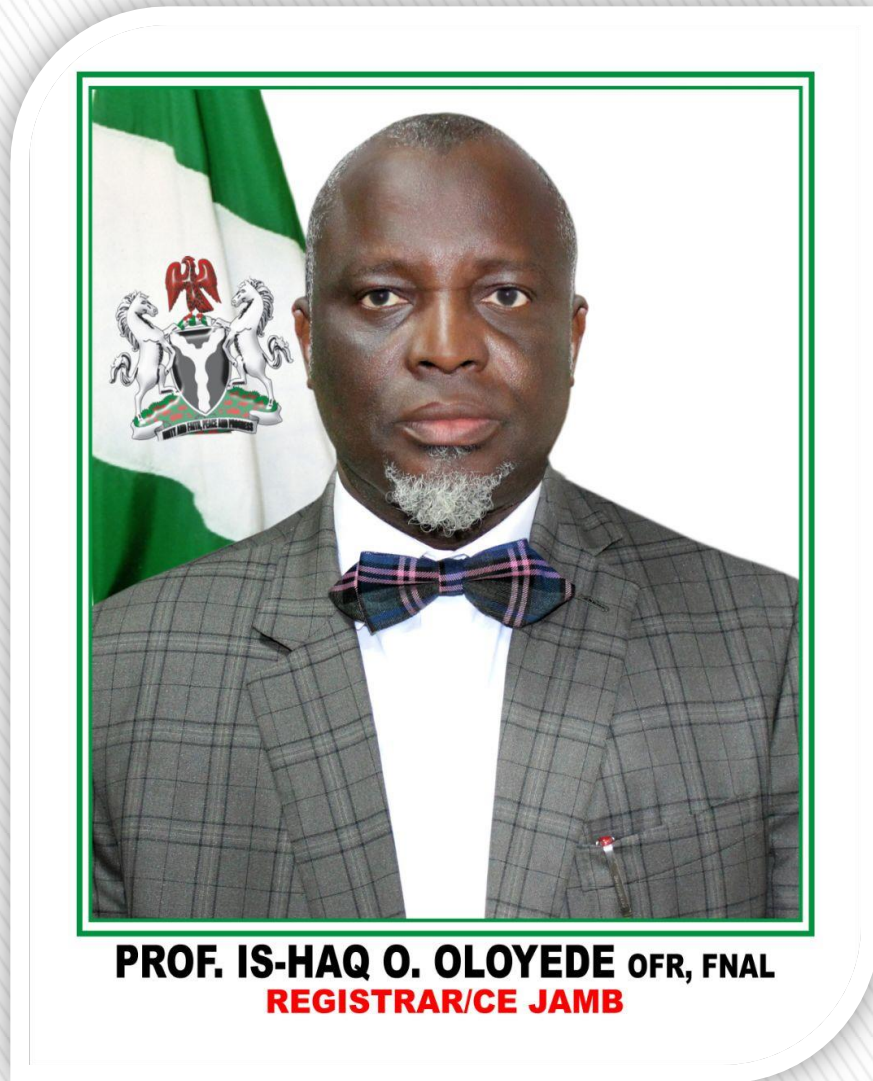

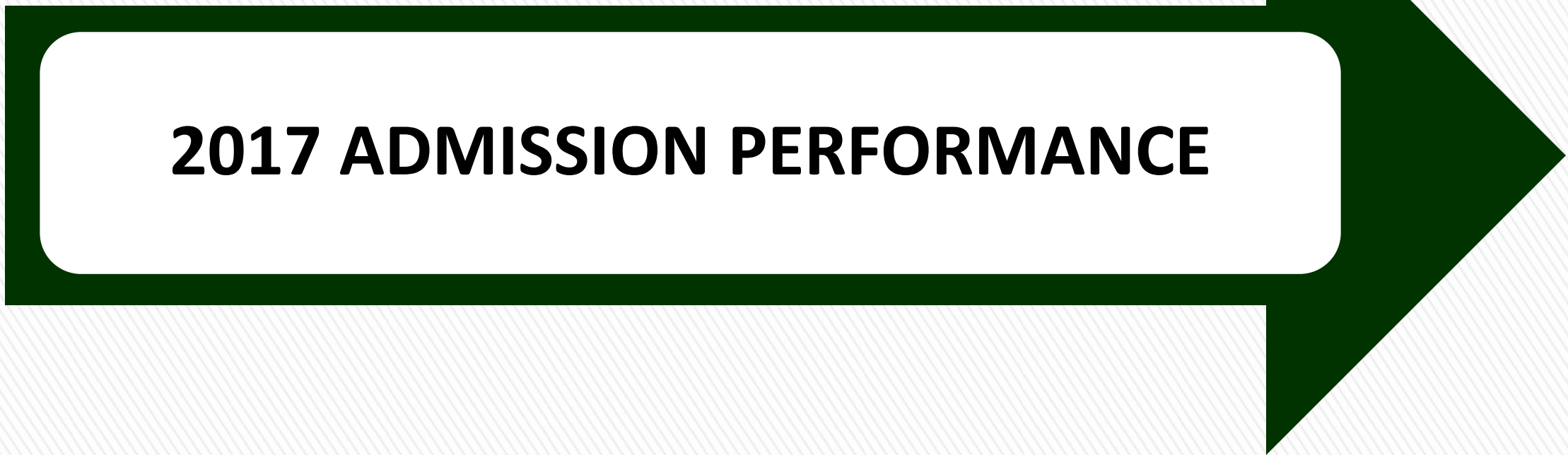
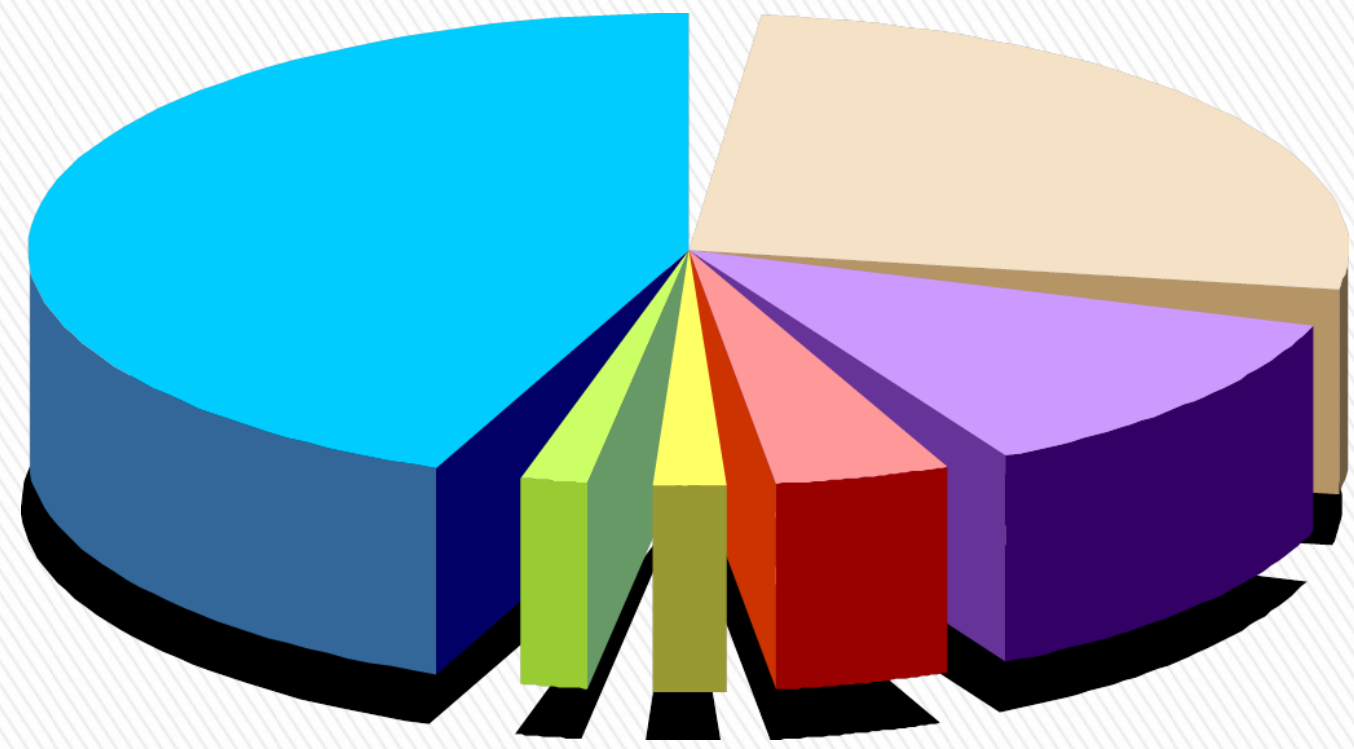

The 2017 Policy Meeting guidelines and decisions were implemented through the Central Admissions Processing System (CAPS)

Desk Officers were assigned to institutions

Institutions present at the meetings also made suggestion for consideration

Minimum National UTME Score & realistic institutional UTME Scores were approved

- **120 for degree-awarding institutions**
- **100 for ND, NID & NCE awarding institutions**

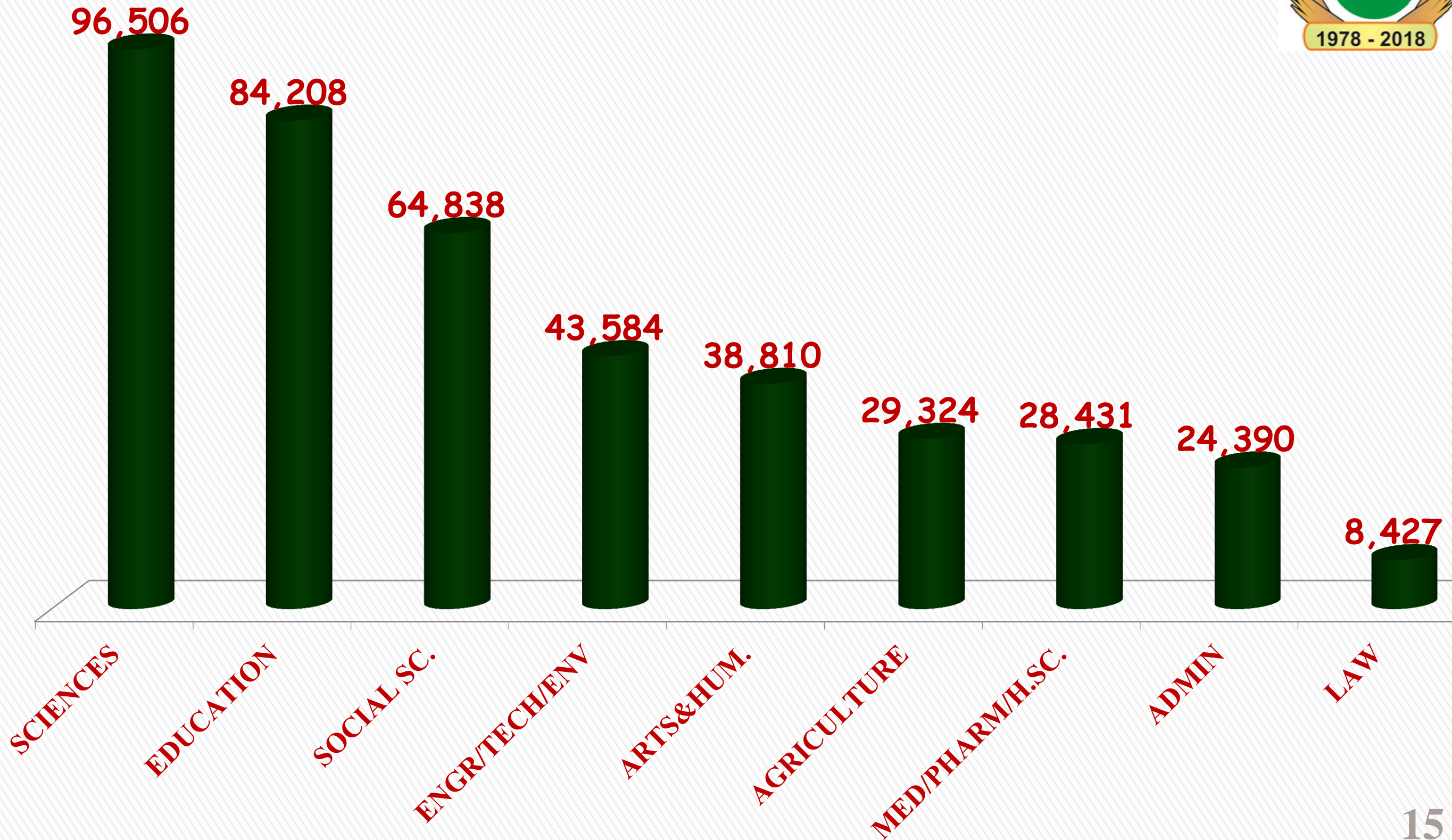

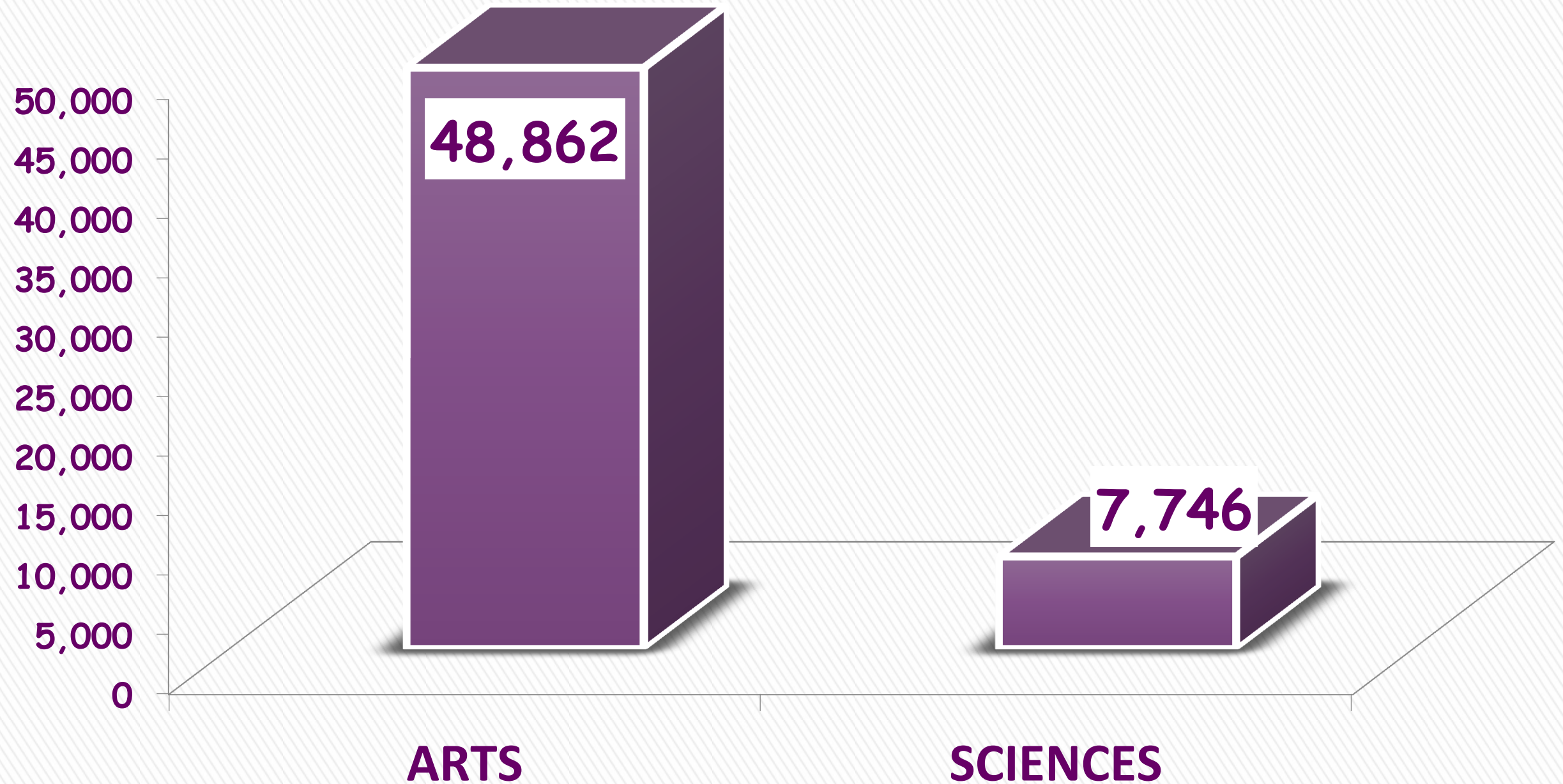

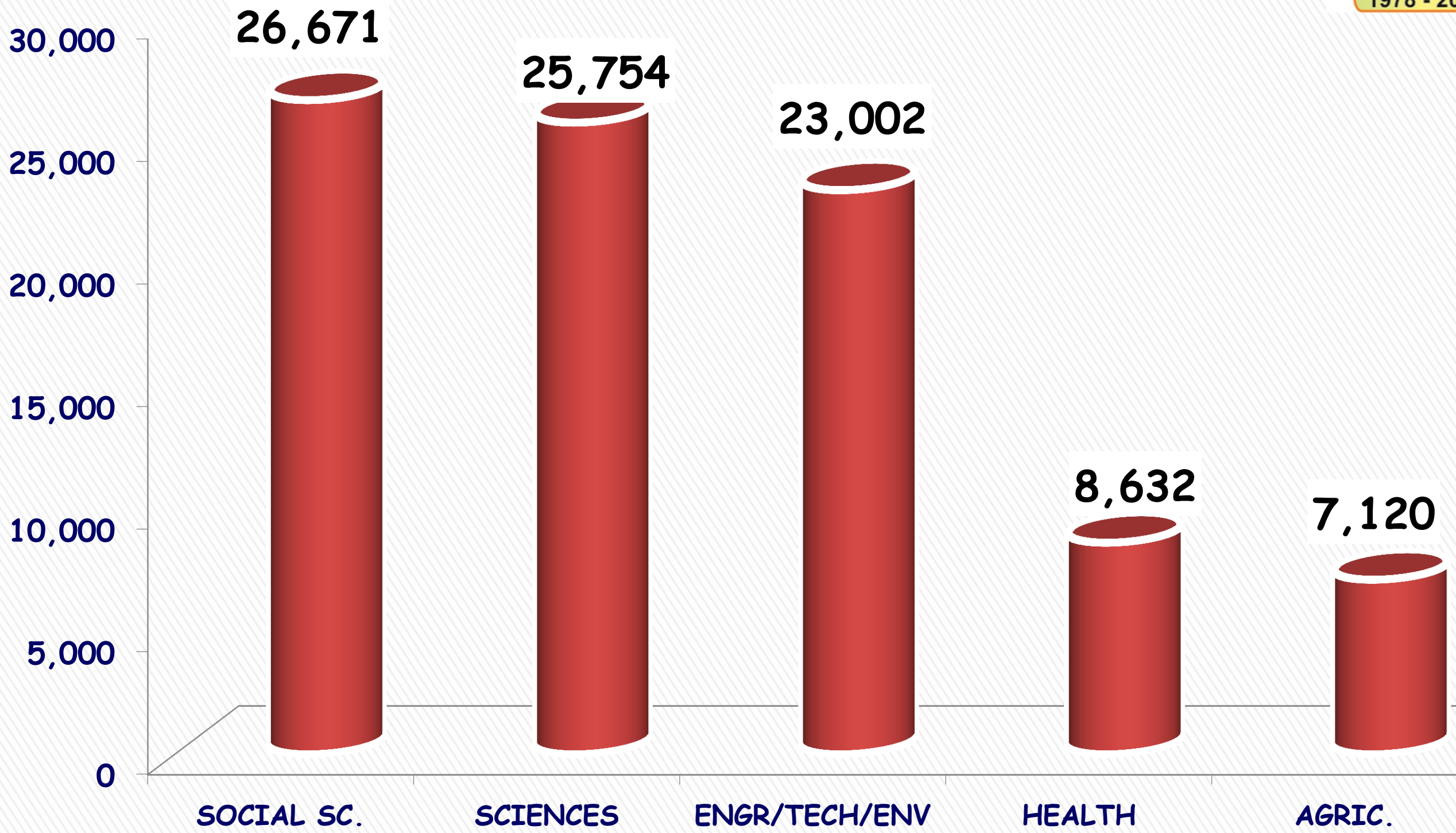
2017 UTME ADMISSION STATISTICS BY FACULTY (DEGREE)



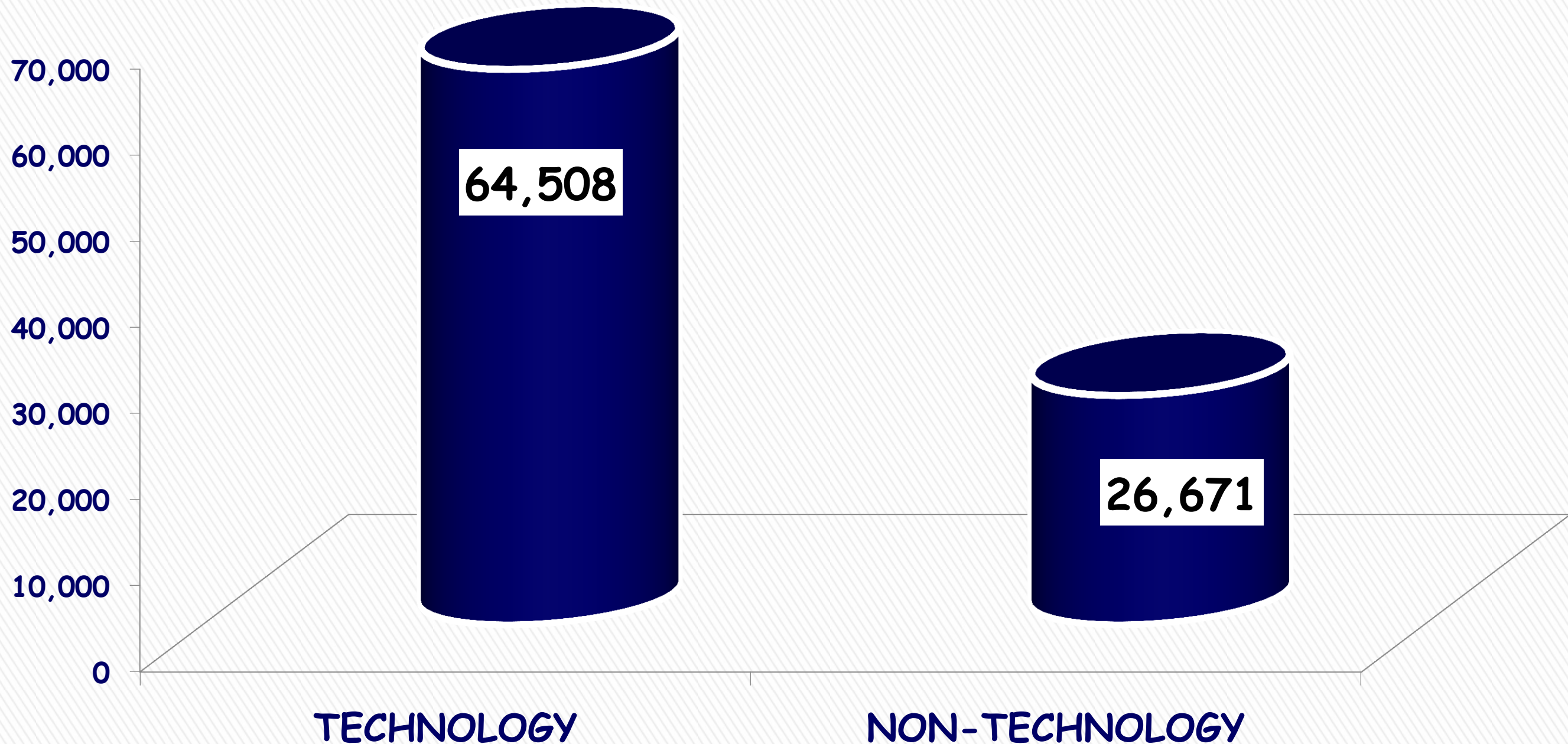
2017 UTME ADMISSION STATISTICS BY SCIENCE/ART RATIO (NCE)

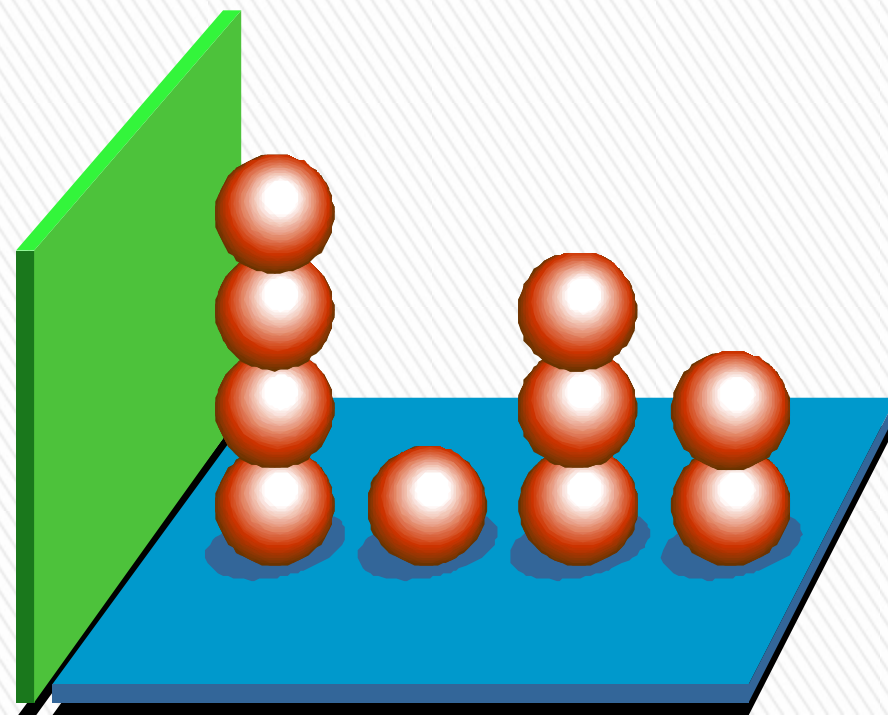


2017 UTME ADMISSION STATISTICS BY FACULTY (ND)

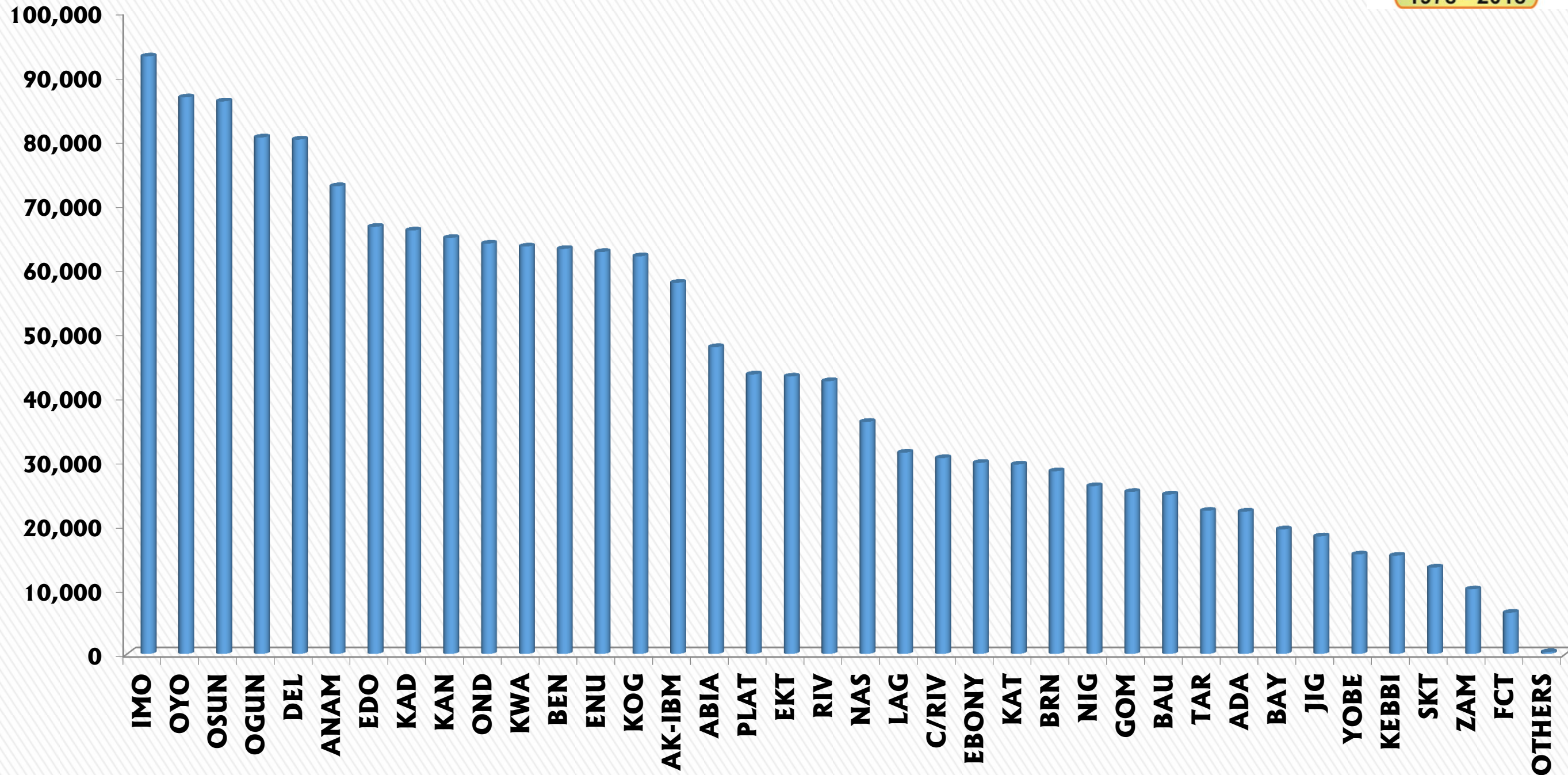

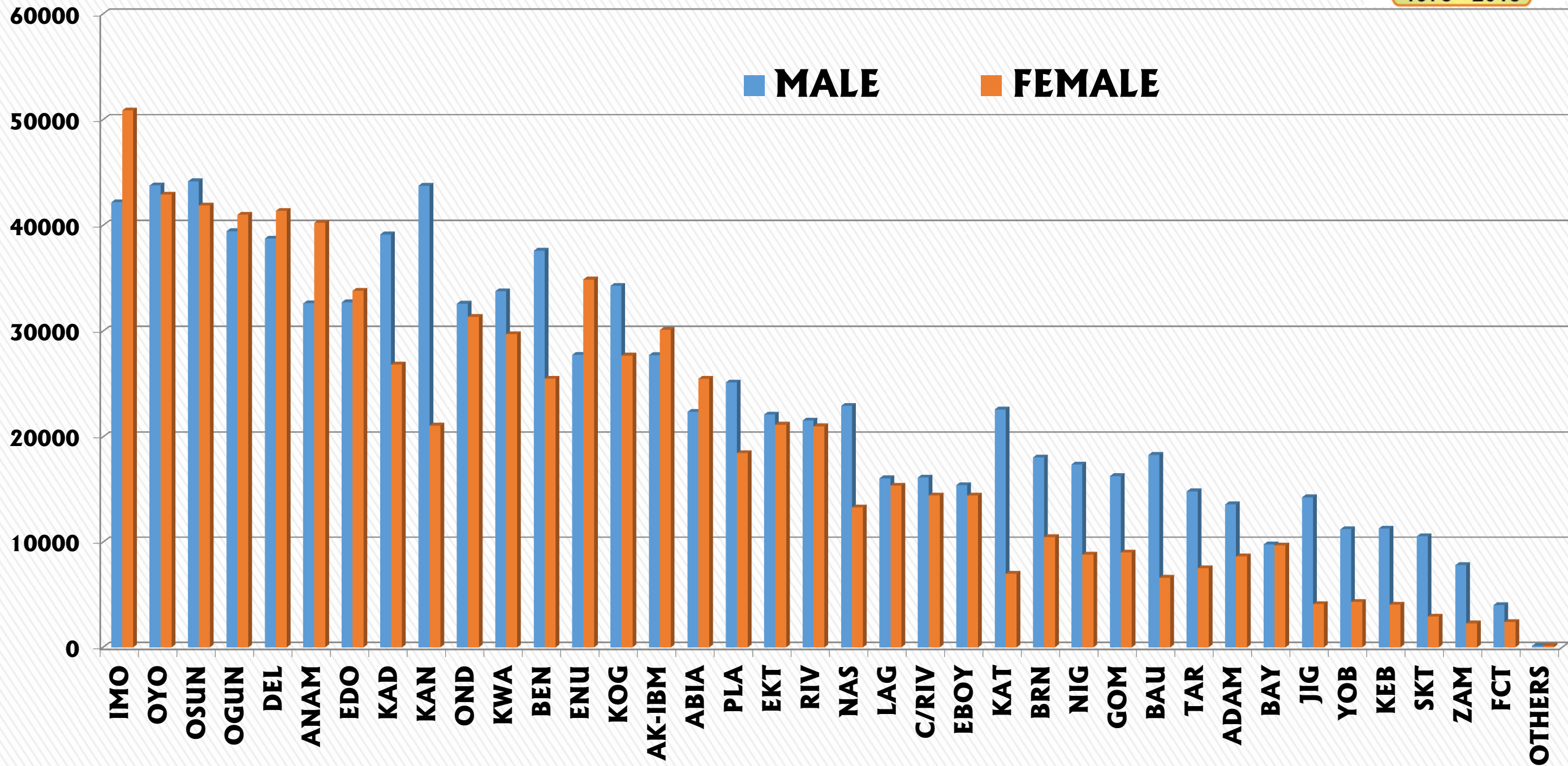

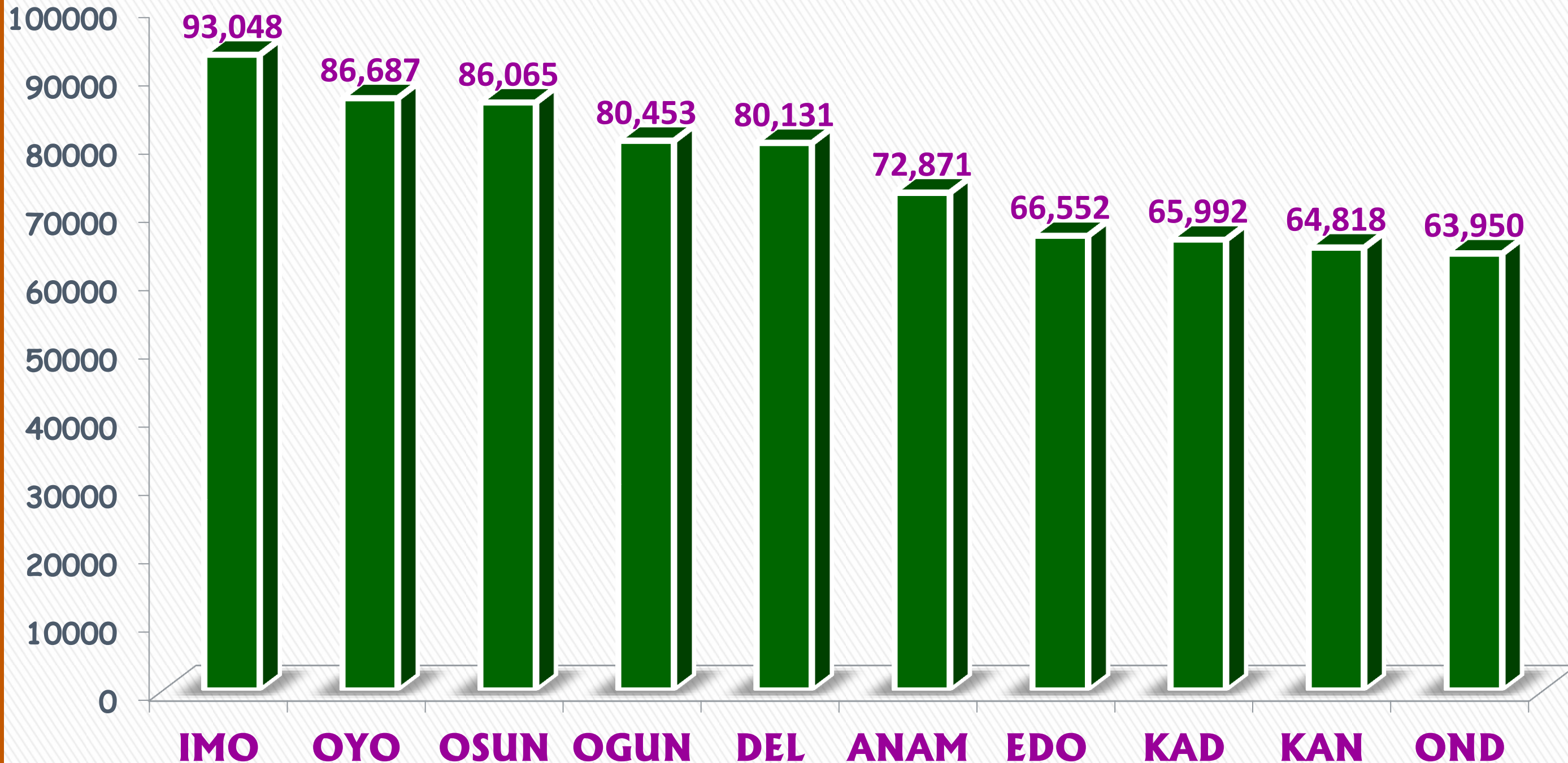
GRAPHICAL REPRESENTATION OF 2018 UTME APPLICATION STATISTICS BY STATES OF ORIGIN



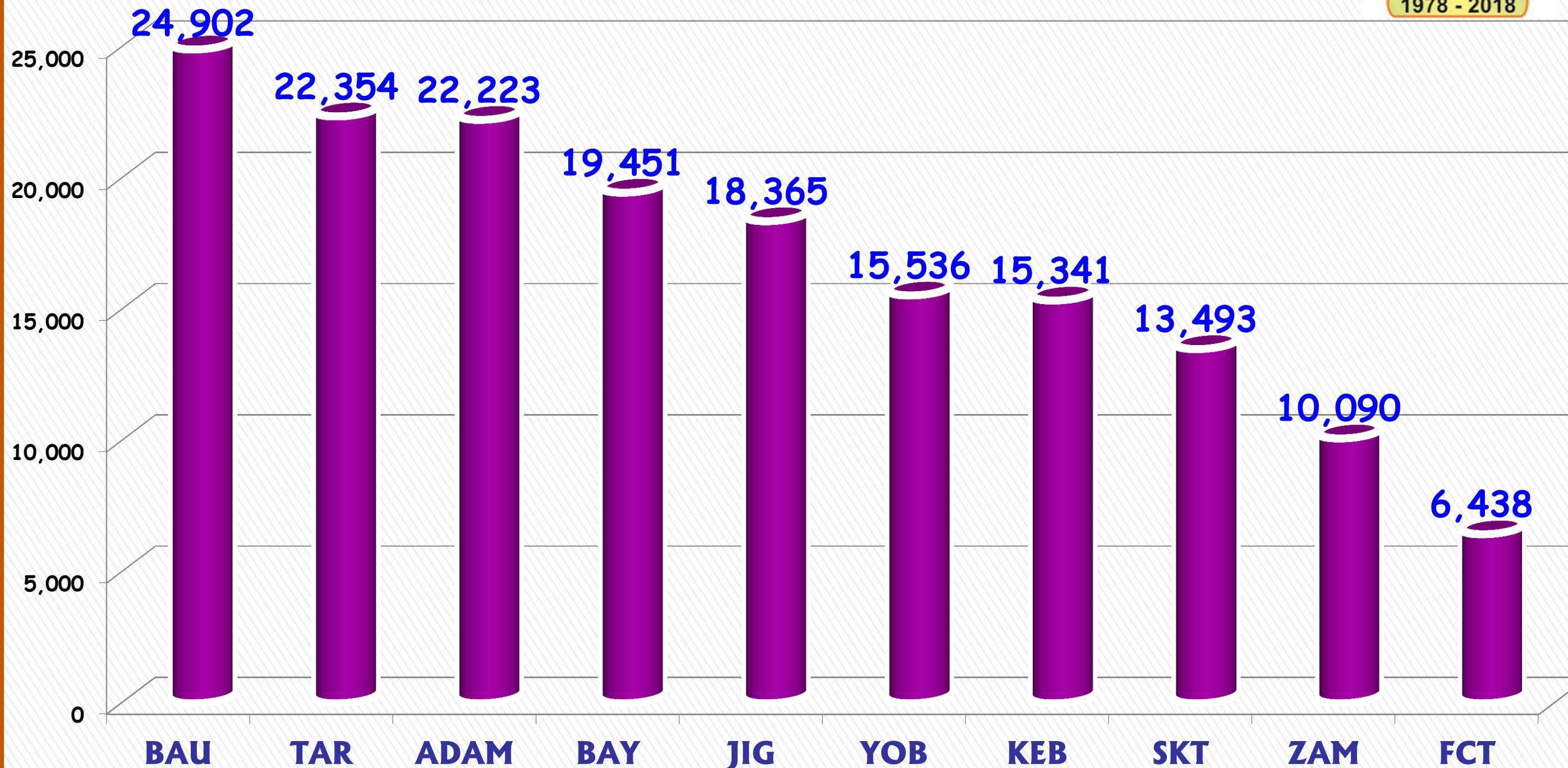
GRAPHICAL REPRESENTATION OF 2018 UTME APPLICATION STATISTICS BY STATES OF ORIGIN & GENDER



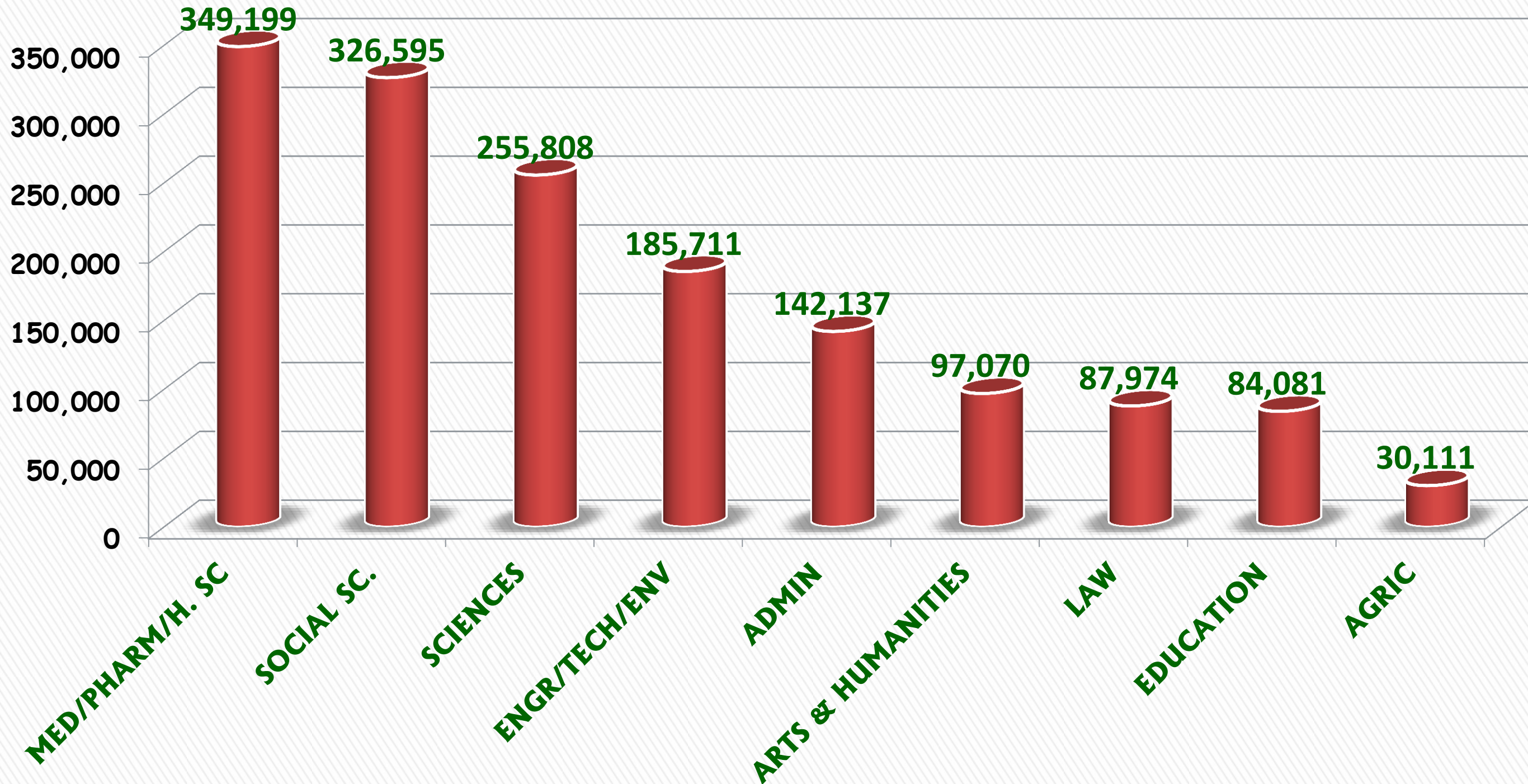
2018 UTME APPLICATION STATISTICS BY STATES OF ORIGIN AND FCT (TOP TEN)



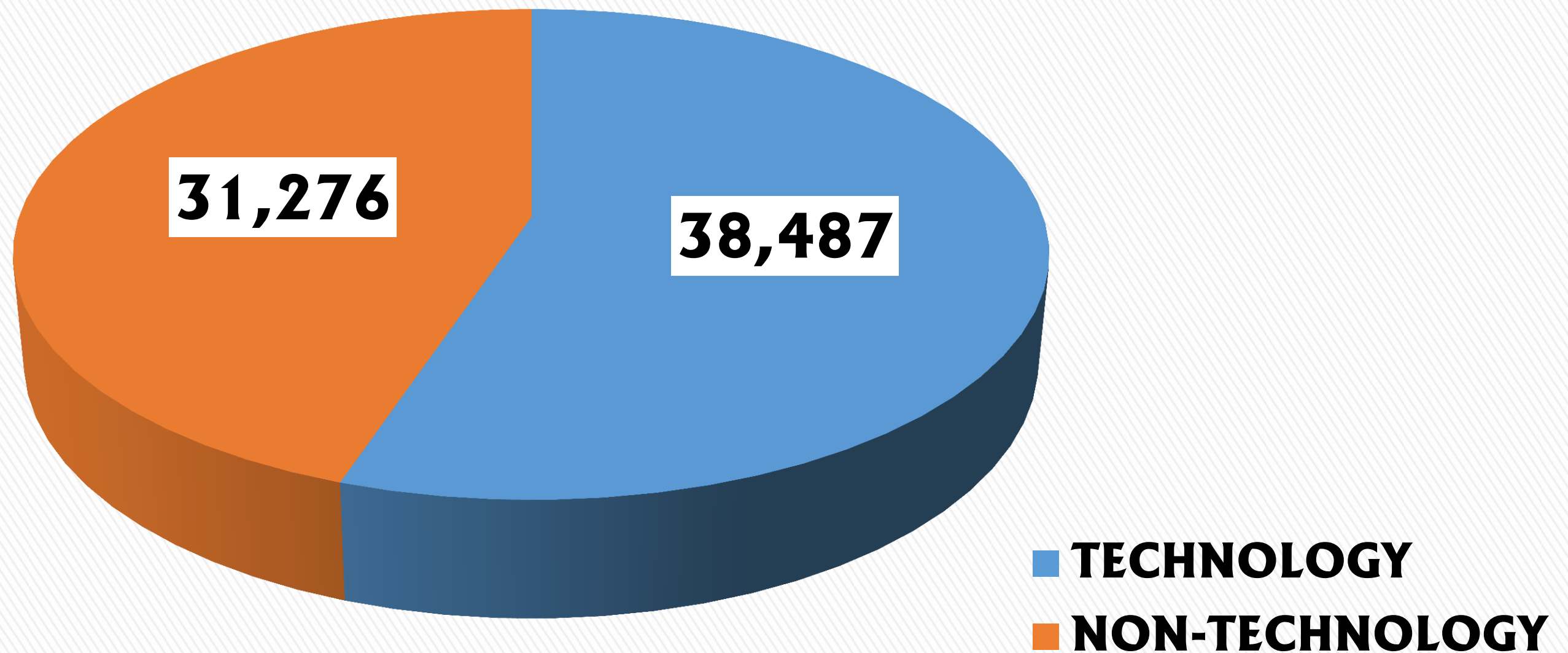
2018 UTME APPLICATION STATISTICS BY STATES OF ORIGIN AND FCT (LOWEST TEN)



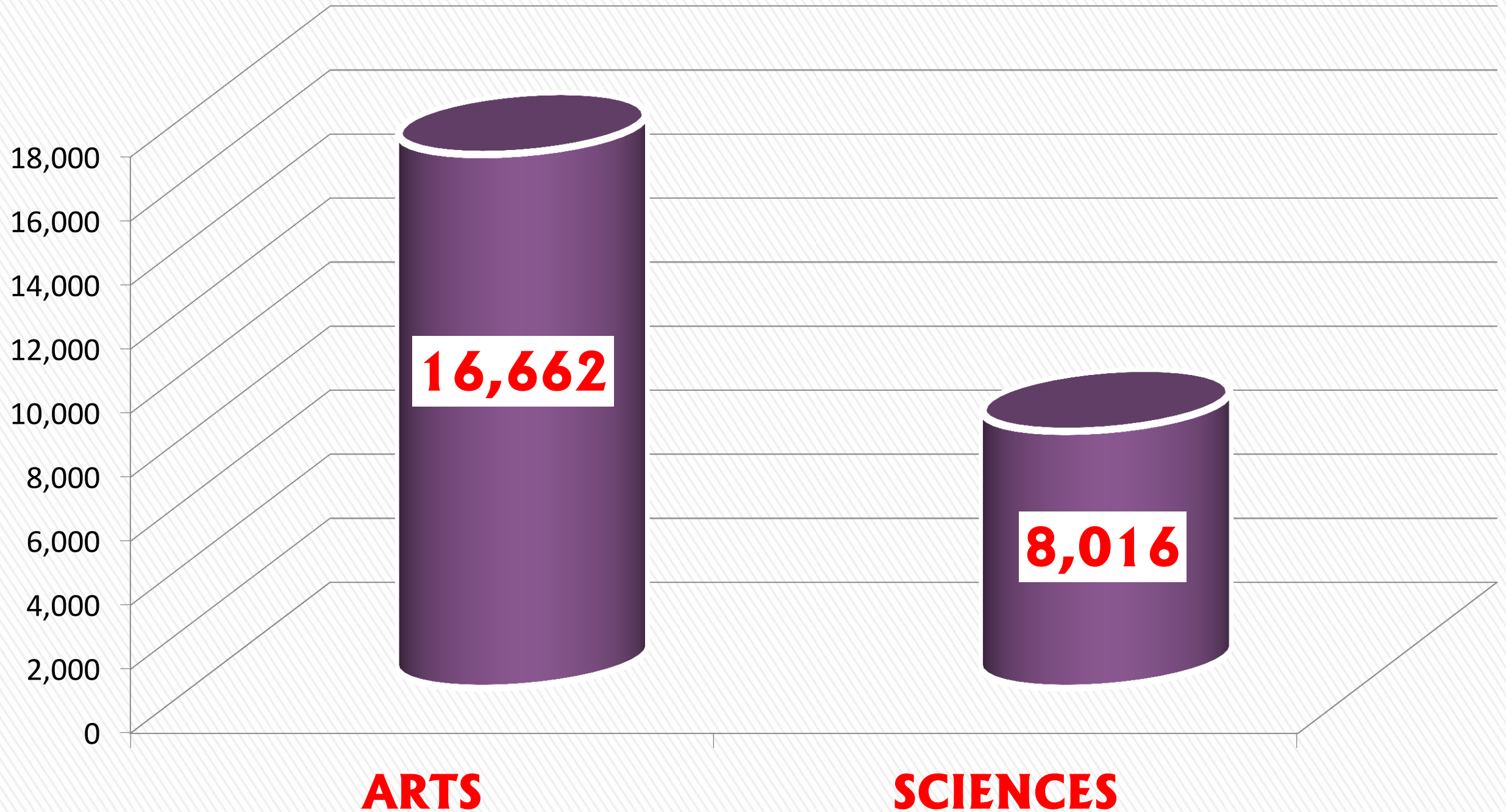
2018 UTME APPLICATION STATISTICS BY FACULTY (DEGREE)

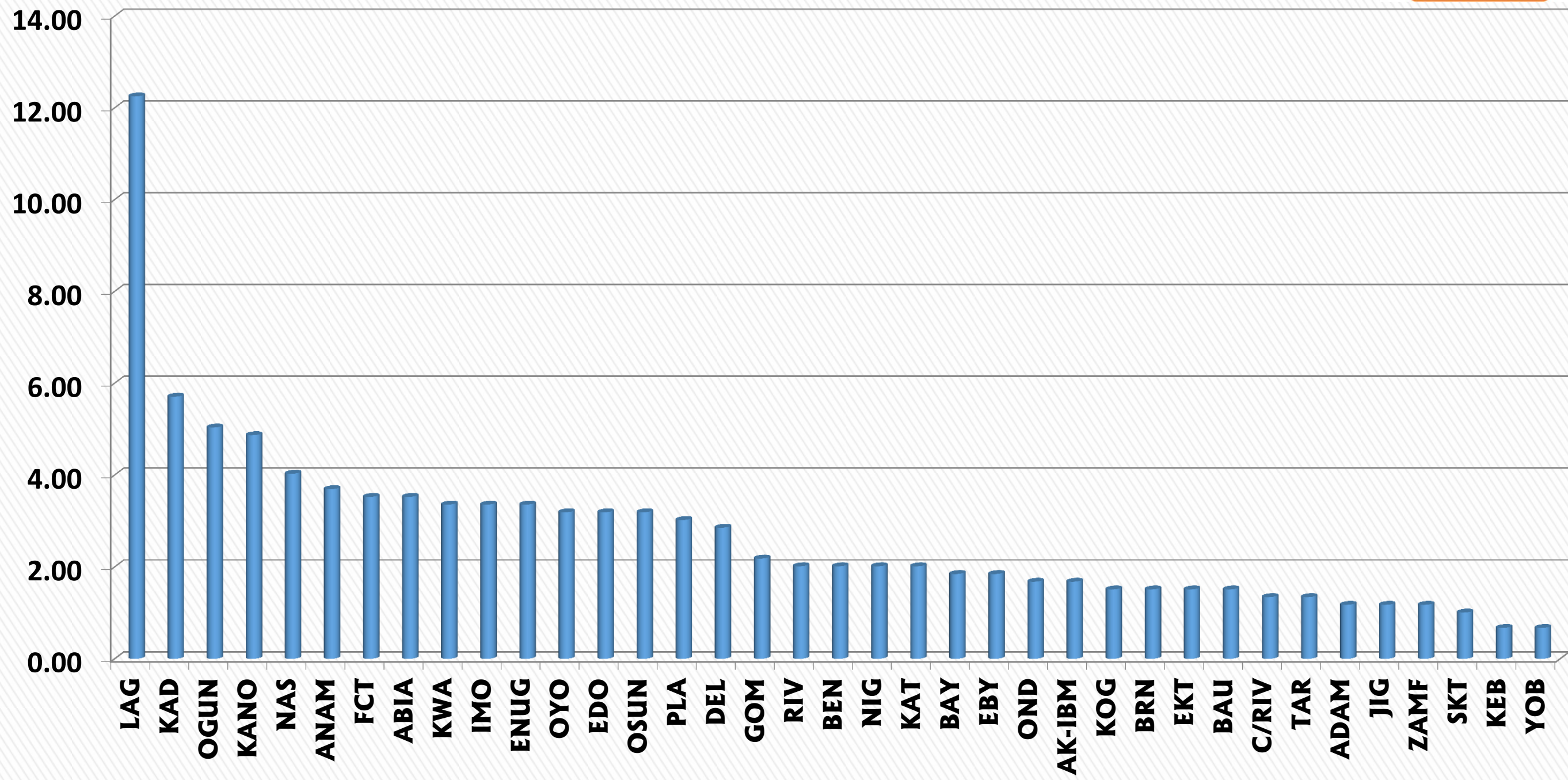

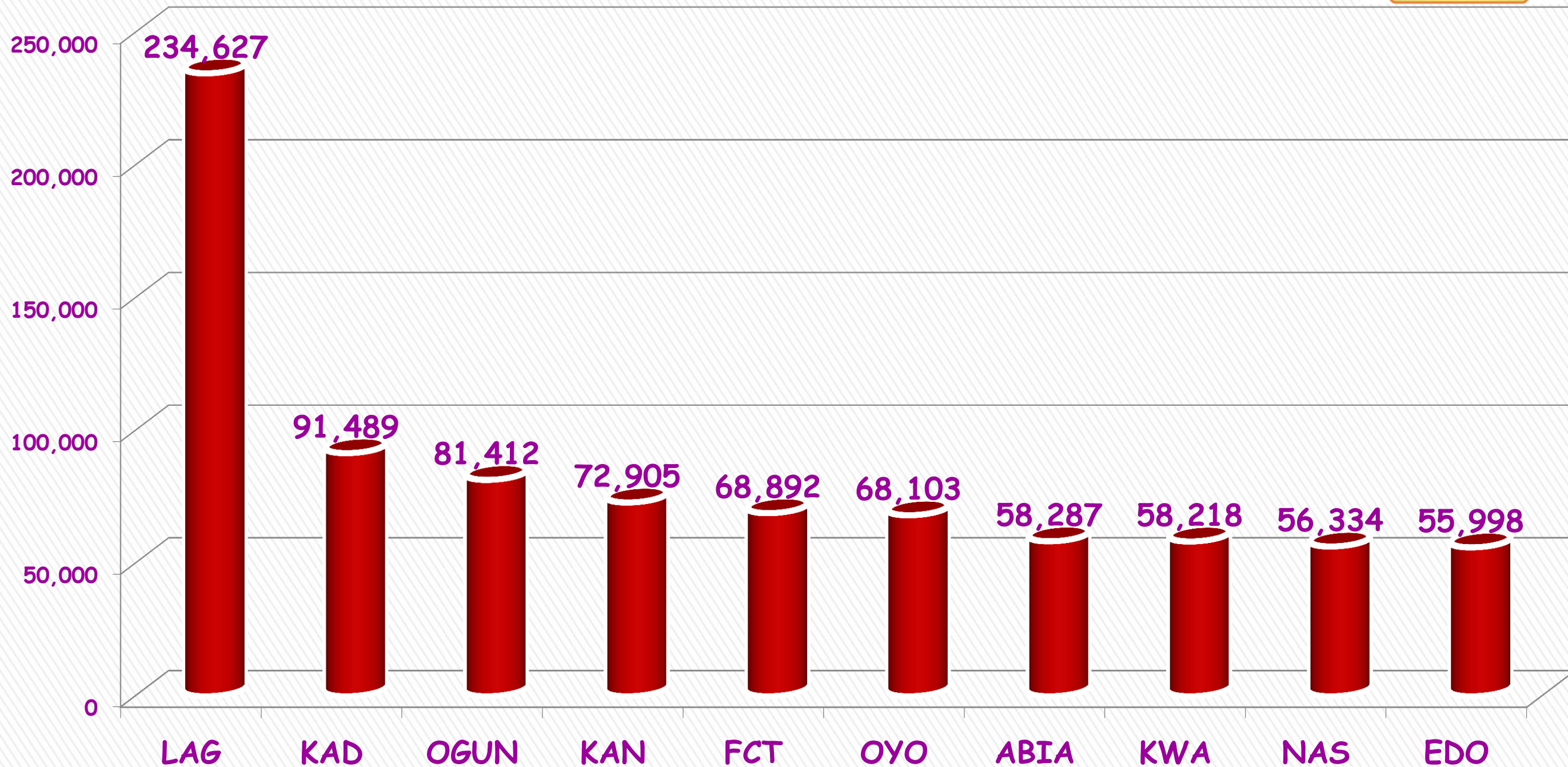

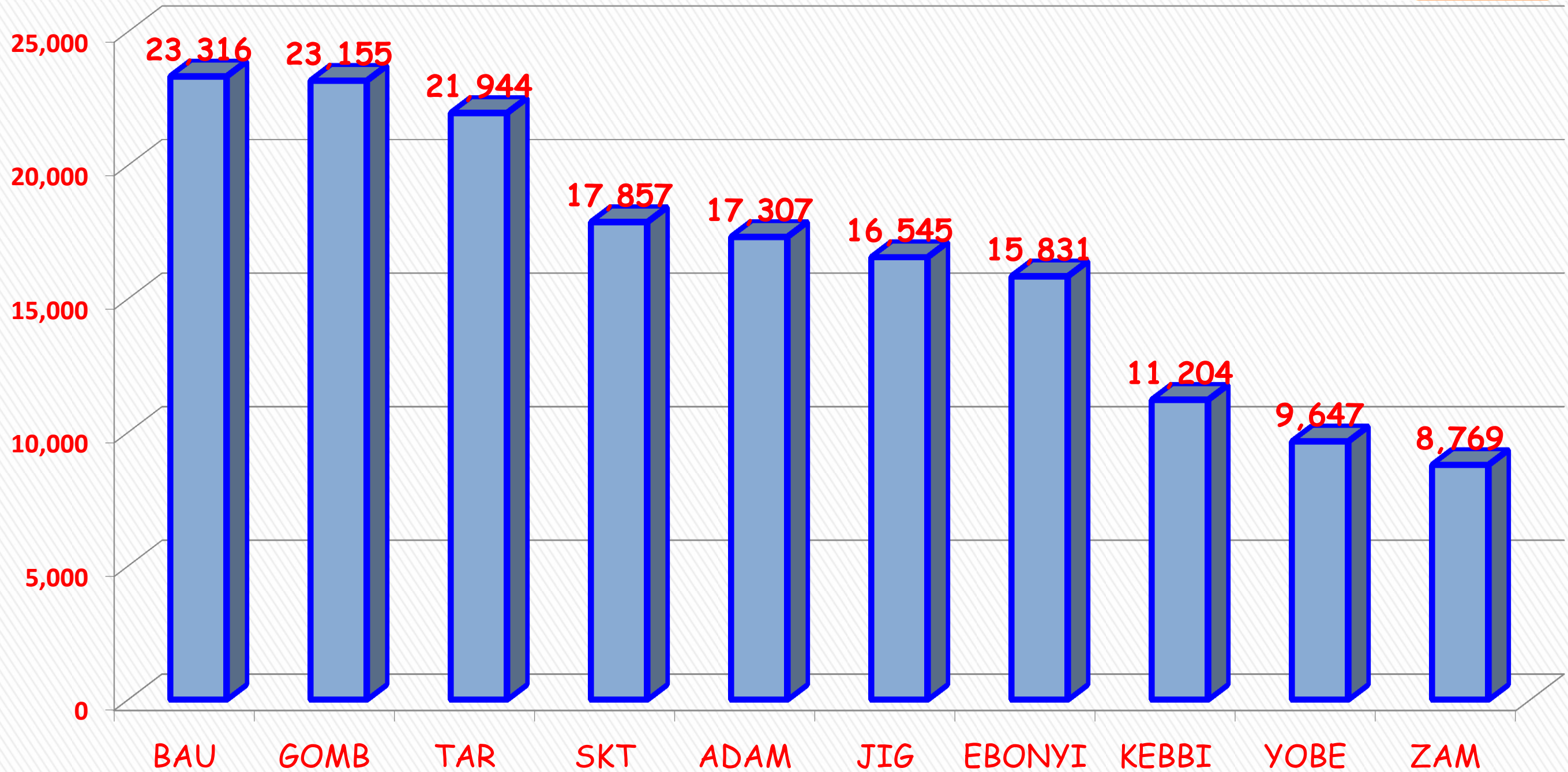
GRAPHICAL REPRESENTATION OF 2018 UTME APPLICATION STATISTICS BY STATES OF EXAMINATION

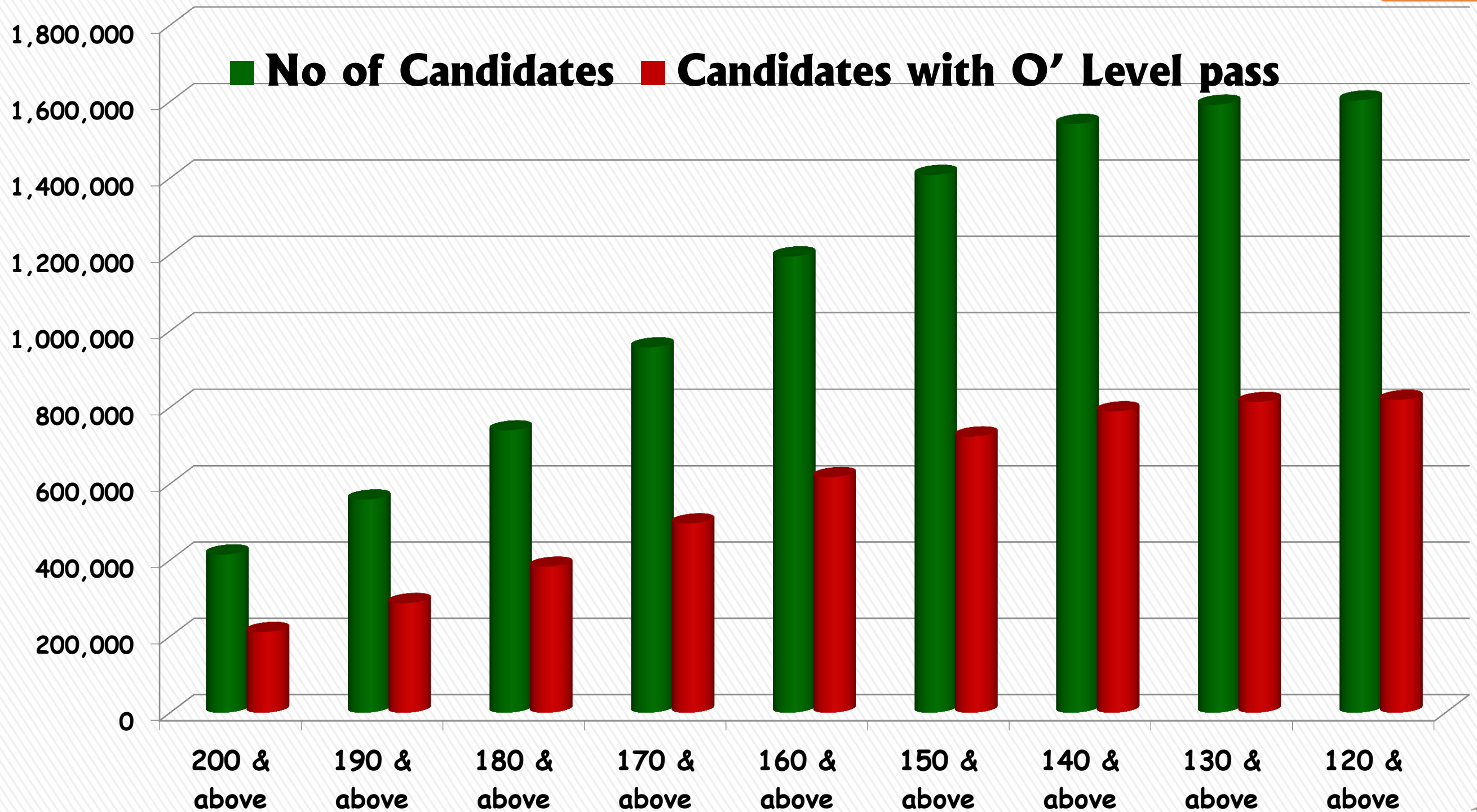

CENTRAL ADMISSION PROCESSING SYSTEM (CAPS)

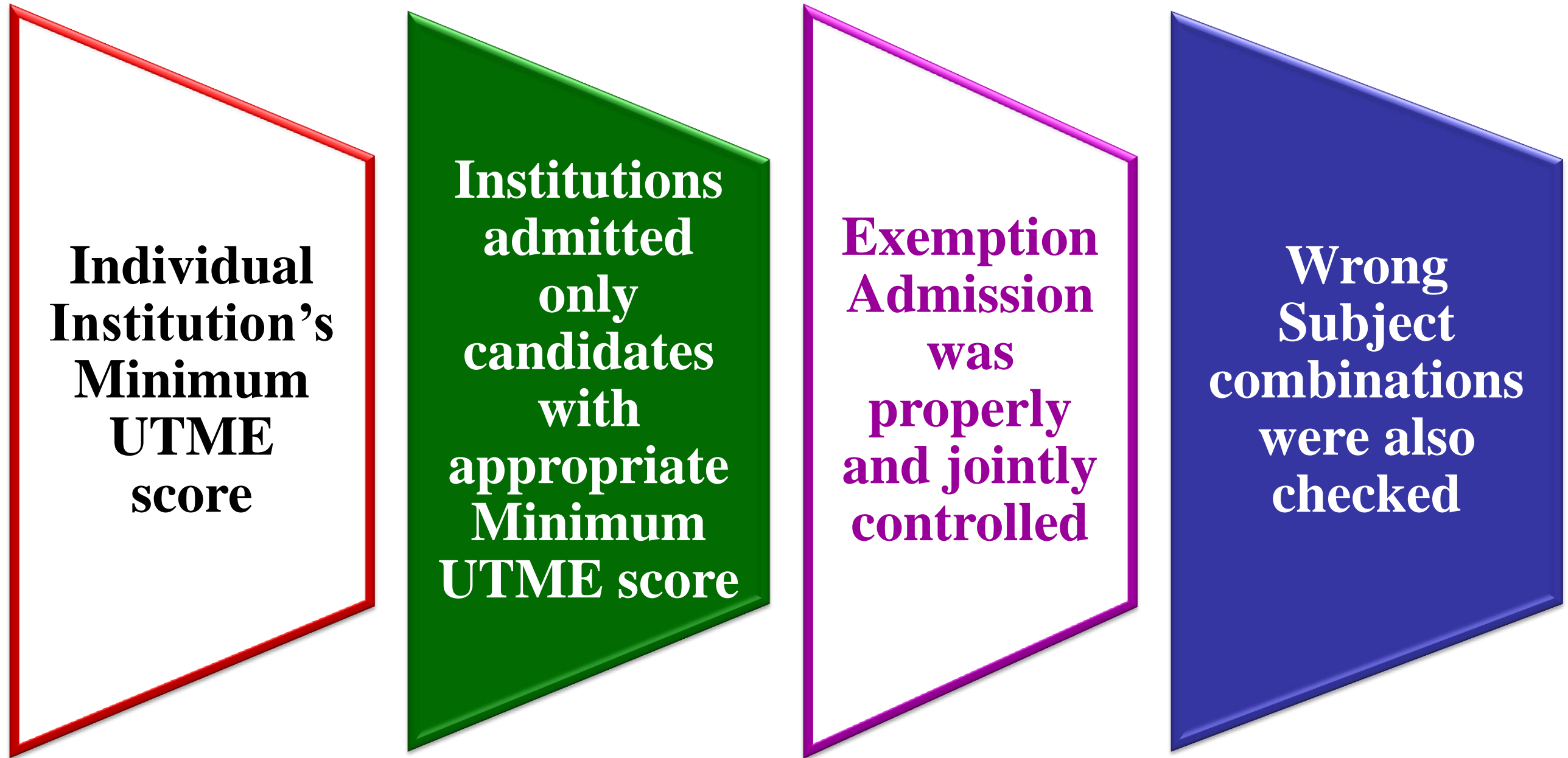
CAPS was developed and introduced in 2017 and was immediately deployed for the conduct of the Admission exercise for 2017/2018 after series of Engagements with Stakeholders

.....Capacity Building Sessions were organised for the institutions and JAMB staff



....on CAPS

1. Restored Autonomy to the Institutions with regards to Admissions process



.....institutions should note that the same cut-off mark is applicable to the mother institution as well as its affiliates

2. Transparency, Openness and Accountability in the Admission Process



Every activity of a User is logged with a date and time stamp

Availability of Data and Information to make decisions, plan better and review existing policies


3. Market Place to Source for Candidates

Every institution was given access to source for candidates through the Market Place

But Candidate's Contacts were not given to institutions to avoid abuse

4. Involvement of Candidates in the Admissions Process



Every Candidate is required to **“Accept”** or **“Reject”** his/her admission before the process is said to be completed

Candidates can now protest their admission status should they feel they are not fairly treated

Institutions concerned now also have a means of revisiting the process

SUBSTITUTION OF ADMISSIONS NOT INVOLVING CANDIDATES

(DELETION/REJECTION):

Using CAPS

*3 scenarios with respect to substitution (deletion/rejection) of admissions arising from CAPS but **NOT** involving candidates*

1. Where A Candidate Does Not Want Admission offered him/her During The Year's Admission Exercise



The candidate would only need to reject the offer of admission & he/she would be available to the institution or any other institution in addition to the market place for reconsideration (recommendation) through CAPS

All rejections automatically release the space thereby creating an opportunity for another candidate on the list immediately

The quota used for candidates would also be released and made available to the institution automatically

2. Where a candidate is Offered Admission and after Acceptance, He/She or the Institution is Desirous of Changing the Programme Offered and Accepted while the Year's Admission is Still in Progress

The candidate will fill and process the **Substitution of Programme Form** which is available on CAPS for download. The Form reads in part **“I have accepted earlier to read..... and now agree that my programme should be changed to”**.

The Head of the institution **MUST** sign the form which would be transmitted to Coordinator of the JAMB State Office for upload to CAPS for Registrar's approval.

Once the Registrar gives approval, the candidate's status will be automatically updated and he/she would be informed through email



3. Where a candidate is Offered Admission and he/she neither accepts nor rejects the offer and institution is desirous of substituting the candidate

- a. The institution would forward the list of the candidates to the Board through CAPS in the following format:

Registration No.	Name	Course Offered	Date of Offer (i.e. date of approval by Desk Officer)	Reason (if any) for non-response	Remark (to include I want to replace, I want to ...e.t.c)

- b. The list must be signed by the Head of the institution for Registrar of JAMB's approval.
- c. Once approved by the Registrar, the candidates would be deleted automatically and quota made available to the institution.

- ✓ All approved requests would be communicated vide the platform provided it is within the approved guidelines of the respective Regulatory Agencies (**NUC, NBTE or NCCE**)
